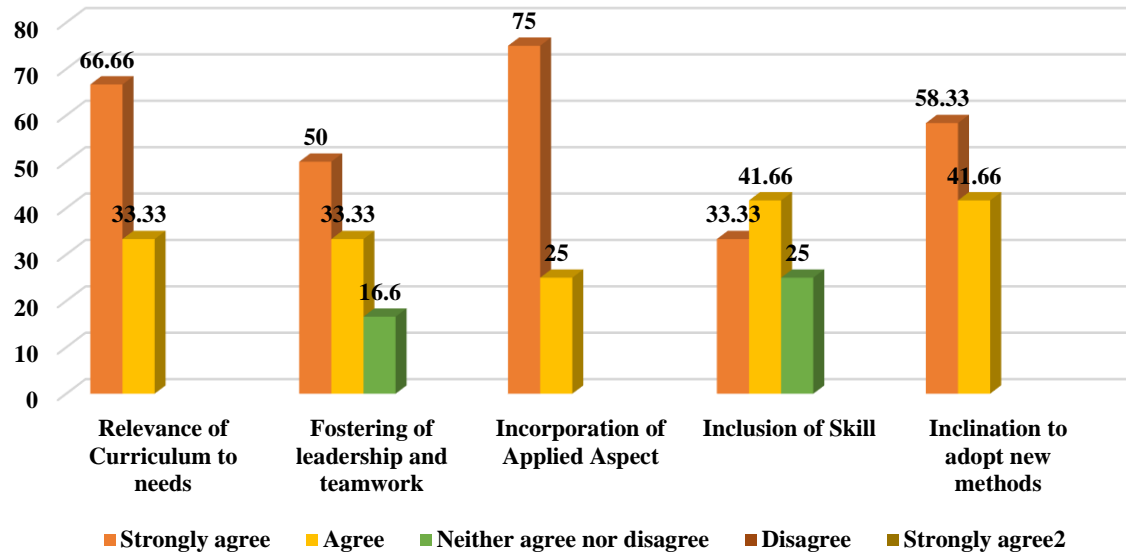

Employer's Feedback on Curricular Aspects



66.66% employers strongly agree that the curriculum is relevant to local, national and global needs. 33.33% agree with the statement. 50% employers strongly agree that the curriculum is employable and fosters leadership qualities and initiative instinct as well as team work spirit in students, whereas, 33.33% agree and 16% were neutral with the statement. 75% employers strongly agree and 25% agree that the curriculum incorporates lab/hands on training/ industrial visits/ field visits to meet the professional demand. 33.33% employers commented that curriculum strongly takes care of development of various soft skills and scope for computer literacy, whereas, 41.66% agree and 25% expects that there should be more inclusion of soft skill and promotion of computer literacy among students. 58.33% employers strongly agree and 41.66% agree that the course content helps the students to learn and adopt new methods and technology.
